

# **WEEKLY REFLECTIONS** Beatitudes: Reverse of the Kingdom:

In today's Gospel, we are given St. Luke's version of the Beatitudes. The word "beatitude" is derived from the Latin word "beatus" which means "happy", "blest", "fortunate". This idea occurs frequently in the psalms and the wisdom literatures of the Old Testament. One was said to be blessed, happy, fortunate when one did what was pleasing to God. St. Matthew gives us eight or nine Beatitudes (Matthew 5:2-12). However, St. Luke's version is different. Unlike St. Matthew who lists eight "blessedness", St. Luke lists four "blessedness" and four Woes. The opposite of blest is woeful, and woe is the lot of the wrongdoer. St. Matthew tells us that Jesus gave this Sermon on the mount. However, St. Luke tells us that Christ had come down from the mountain, where he had spent the night in prayer; he was surrounded by a crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from Judea and Jerusalem, Tyre and Sidon.

However, in both Gospels the essence of Christ's teaching is the same. The beatitudes that Christ preached to his disciples that day long ago in far-off Galilee applies to us equally today. We must never let the things of this world keep us away from God. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven": The poor in spirit are those who feel a deep sense of spiritual destitution and comprehend their nothingness before God. The kingdom of heaven is theirs, because they seek it, and therefore find and abide in it.

"Blessed are they that mourn for they shall be comforted". The blessing is not upon all that mourn but upon those who mourn in reference to their sins. They shall be comforted by the discovery and appropriation of God's pardon. "Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth". The humble would receive far greater than the arrogant and prideful. Not only do the meek enjoy more of life on earth because of their ability to be content, but they will possess and enjoy the earth after Jesus' return.

The beatitude is the reverse of the kingdom. In the kingdom of this world, you have to be powerful, intimidating, and if you really want to succeed, you

have to be prepared to eliminate your opponents or your enemies. In the kingdom of this world, it is the survival of the fittest; in the kingdom of this world, man is a wolf to his fellow man. This is what it takes to climb the ladder of success in this world.

However, Christ teaches us the opposite in the Beatitudes; he turns the way to succeed in the world upside down and shows us the way to succeed on our journey towards heaven. Beatitudes are truly the reverse of the kingdom! The Beatitude is the map quest to our heavenly home. The question we have to ask ourselves individually today is this: which map quest am I following? Am I following the way of the world or am I following the way of the beatitudes? The bottom line of the beatitudes and of this message is that nothing so rewarding than having Jesus in our lives and following his ways.
