

WEEKLY REFLECTIONS "With Man This Is Impossible, But With God All Things Are Possible:"

Love is a command when Jesus says, "Love your enemies" (Luke 6:27). He knows that not everyone will accept such a command, and for this reason, he begins by making it clear that he is addressing those who are willing to accept this command of love of enemies. When he says, "To you who hear, I say...", he means, "To you who are willing to do what I command you to do". It is obvious to him that not everyone who is following him is willing to do what he commands. It is for this reason that he told his followers that, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). Therefore, today's Gospel is addressed, not to the "followers" of Christ or "Church goers" or "hearers of the word", but to those who are willing to accept the teachings of Christ. Before we proceed, we all have to ask ourselves individually, am I among those willing to do what Christ commands us to do, or am I just a "Church goer" or a "follower"?

The commandment of love of enemies is humanly impossible. It is not in our human nature to love our enemies and to do good to those who hate us. Is Jesus therefore, asking us to do what is impossible? Of course not! What makes Christians different and what makes Christianity distinct from any other religion is GRACE. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines grace thus, "Grace is favor, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life". So, Christ will never ask us to do what is impossible; he will never lead us where his grace will not save us. The grace he has given each and everyone of us helps us to transcend our human nature and do those things that we cannot do on our own as human beings. It is not all about us - it is all about the grace of God working in us and through us.

Our prayer for those who do us ill breaks the power of revenge and releases the power of love to do good in the face of evil. How can we possibly love those who cause us harm or illwill? With God all things are possible. He gives power and grace to those who believe and accept the gifts of the Holy Spirit. His love conquers all, even our hurts, fears, prejudices and griefs. Only the grace of God can free us from the tyranny of malice, hatred, revenge, and resentment and gives us the courage to return evil with good. Such love and grace have power to heal us and to save us from destruction. That is why Paul the Apostle tells those who know the love and mercy of Jesus Christ to "bless and not curse.. nor take revenge.. and to overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:14,17,21).
